Chapter Members Embracing Competition in Pursuit of Better Grades

With a new school year beginning, our Acacia chapter continues to make grades and academics a top priority. This is the case due to the ever-evolving scholarship system put in place. The Acacia Alumni Scholarship Award Program (AASAP) continues to reward the magnificent work the students continue to do. Another system in place is the academic grade teams created by the chapter. This is a system that rewards improvement and achievement and has paid dividends for the house.

The system has been in place for a couple of years and has been passed down, and the process continues to improve. The team is based on a tier system. The chapter is split into five tiers of GPA segments from top GPAs to bottom GPAs. So, the top tier has the top GPAs down to the fifth tier which has the lowest GPAs. Each tier is then randomized and lined up so that it makes a team of five with one member from each tier on a team together. The reason it is random is to eliminate bias and it makes it as fair as it could possibly be.

Scoring is a weighted system based on improvement. Since each team has one member from each of the five tiers, each member from each tier is competing against their tier. If you get the highest GPA for the semester in your tier, you will get the most points from that tier of people. To incentivize the fifth tier to improve, their points are weighted the most. It means more for your fifth-tier member to do the best than you first tier member. Whichever team gets the highest total of points, wins the competition.

After analyzing the results from our grade reports from last semester, the winners have been determined. They are **Daniel Grober '13**, **Scott Jacobson '15**, **Mike Jang '14**, **Paul Kalhoon 'YR**, and **Alexander Moore '13**. Due to their great achievements, they will be receiving a \$200 scholarship award from the Acacia scholarship fund.





Acacia Illinois House Improvements Continue

The Alumni Corporation Board continues to maintain and make improvements to the chapter house and property every year.

A major improvement this past fiscal year has been the complete renovation of the two primary bathrooms in the 34-man East Wing. The 50-year-old bathrooms were updated with new ceramic floor and wall tile, plumbing fixtures, ceiling, ventilating system, and lighting. The cost of the project was \$57,300.

The work began in May on a new heating and air conditioning system for the East Wing. The East Wing is currently heated but not air conditioned. Heating and cooling was accomplished with a mini-split, air-to-air heat pump system. The system provides all cooling (air conditioning) during hot weather and most of the heat required during cold weather. The existing hot water heating system is used to supplement heat only when needed during extremely cold weather. The new system was completed before brothers returned in August for the fall semester. Plans are in place for a similar system to be installed in the West Wing next year.

This summer was the start of a multi-year window replacement project. A limited number of the 50-year-old windows in the East Wing were replaced this year with new high efficiency windows and with more to follow in subsequent years.

The Alumni Corporation Board will continue to evaluate needs and plan improvements to provide a living environment that is best of class and competitive with the many choices that students have at the University of Illinois.
