

# Seven Fraternities Ready For Nationalization Tonight

## Distinguished Guests Arrive

Installation for seven local fraternities on campus into their national organizations is slated for this weekend. Alpha Tau Omega, Delta Tau Delta, Kappa Alpha, Phi Kappa Tau, Pi Kappa Alpha, Sigma Alpha Epsilon and Theta Chi will admit the colonies.

Official installation ceremonies will be held this evening and tomorrow morning.

Activities scheduled today through Sunday will be highlighted by the Inter-Fraternity banquet at 6 p m Saturday, March 5, in the east dining hall. Senator Spessard L. Holland will make the principal address, followed by a brief welcome speech by Governor Fuller Warren. Dr Doak S Campbell, president of Florida State University, and Dr J Broward Culpepper, dean of student welfare, will act as hosts to the fraternities and their distinguished alumni guests.

Over 400 out-of-town members, including delegations from the University of Florida, Florida Southern College, University of Miami and Stetson University, will be present.

Some of the honor guests who are expected to attend are: Representative George B Smathers; Hinson Markham, member of the state Board of Control; Dick Ervin, Florida Attorney General; Colin English, Coordinator of Higher Education; Alto Adams, Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court; Justice Glenn Terrell and Harley W Chandler, dean of the University of Florida.

Other distinguished fraternity men who have been invited but are not expected to attend include: General George Marshall, Senator Claude Pepper, J Edgar Hoover, Randolph Scott, and A B "Happy" Chandler.

Following the banquet tomorrow night, the Installation Ball will be held at the Student Union on West campus from 9 p m till midnight. All students and visitors have been invited to attend and dance to the music of Bob Cole's orchestra.

Church services Sunday morning complete the plans for the weekend.

The local colonies were organized at FSU in the fall of 1947 by a few fraternity members. This weekend approximately 250 men will be admitted nationally into the fraternal orders.
