




ATΩ to Re-Charter on January 16, 2010 All Alumni Invited



On March 5, 1949, the Alpha Theta Pi Colony officially became the Epsilon Sigma Chapter of Alpha Tau Omega. Sixty years, ten months and eleven days since the original chartering of the Epsilon Sigma Chapter, $AT\Omega$ will re-charter at Florida State University in a weekend-long series of events and celebrations on January 15-16, 2010.

"This is a monumental achievement," said former $AT\Omega$ National President and Florida Fourth District Court of Appeal Judge **Cory Ciklin '77**. " $AT\Omega$ became an official fraternity on March 5, 1949, and now we're taking our place again as a viable member of the Florida State and $AT\Omega$ communities."

The official re-chartering ceremony will take place on Saturday, January 16, 2010, beginning at 12:00 noon at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Tallahassee on Meridian Road in Tallahassee.

Thanks to fundraising efforts led by the new alumni Board of Trustees and alumni House Corporation, Epsilon Sigma alumni will present a gift of new Ritual equipment for use during the ceremony and in the future.

Following the private, $AT\Omega$ -only Initiation Ceremony, Badge Speech and Installation of Officers, the new initiates, their dates, parents, alumni and special guests will gather at the University Center Club for the Re-Chartering Banquet. Tickets to the Chartering Banquet cost \$40 for $AT\Omega$ students and their dates and \$60 for everyone else (parents, alumni, guests). New Board of Trustees Advises Colony

When $AT\Omega$ began the process of recruiting new members to help re-found Epsilon Sigma at Florida State University, they also implemented a new alumni advising structure for the colony.

The alumni Board of Trustees officially "split" from the House Corporation to provide direct oversight, guidance and mentorship to the members and officers of the new chapter.

"The BOT is really an extension of the national headquarters," explained Chairman **Rob Clarke '76**. "We have authority to intervene when a problem arises, but our primary goal is to provide a support structure to the officers to help them succeed."

"Because the housing challenges facing $AT\Omega$ are so daunting," said House Corporation President Fred Maglione '93, "we felt it best to divide duties so two organizations could focus their missions on two very distinct areas."

Most Board of Trustees members are paired with a particular chapter officer or committee chairman. The BOT member advises and serves as a resource to his officer.

Members of the alumni house corporation will continue to manage the main asset of the corporation – the property at Heritage Grove. They will also continue to explore options and develop a plan to solve AT Ω 's need for a long-term housing solution. Part of this responsibility includes conducting fundraising activities, holding alumni social events and overseeing the alumni communication program.
