INDIANA EPSILON NEEDS YOUR HELP TODAY

Fellow Phis, this month rather than featuring a famous Phi, I thought it would be more appropriate to pass on the message from our board meeting during Hanover's Homecoming weekend on September 20.

The meeting opened with a report from the Indiana Epsilon House Dad Andy Dalton, who reported that he is very pleased with the culture of the house with 42 active members living in the house and five outside. The last pledge class initiated 22 new brothers keeping the Chapter at the top of Hanover fraternities. An additional 20 pledges is the goal for 2015. Andy also reported that new keys and locks have been installed for security purposes.

We are also extremely proud of the efficiency of the new kitchen and the introduction of Connie Lynch, who is in charge of the food production. The lower level, kitchen, eating area, party room and new Chapter room look like new. In addition, Debbie Cloyd has been hired to keep the Chapter House as clean as can be considering the house's population. I encourage you at your next available opportunity to stop by the house, introduce yourself, and tour the Chapter House. You will be very pleased.

Board President **Jon Bond '97** then reported on the fiscal status of the house, which is in crucial need of your support. The chapter continues to owe the college approximately \$225,000 as a long standing result from the mold problem we addressed several years back. In addition, we also have a balance with the national fraternity's Palmer Fund; we do hope to pay off most of this debt by the conclusion of the capital campaign.

We are truly thankful to the 111 Brothers who have contributed more than \$265,000 to *The Campaign for Indiana Epsilon: Beginning a New Era*. The projects we hope to complete to keep the house in its current terrific shape include:

- Paving the parking area.
- Burying a power line that reaches the house in an awkward place.
- Remodeling the bathrooms (can you imagine, 42 men use the same bathroom).
- Adding two rooms in the third-floor area to increase house population and income.
- Repair the front porch.
- Paint, carpet repair, and maintenance.

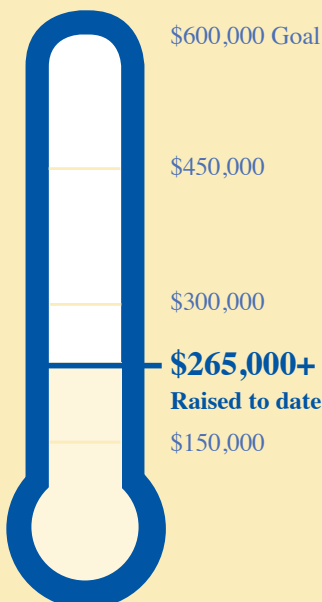


How do we plan to finance projects and debt? We would have had a deficit problem had it not been for the current capital campaign. Using some of the collection, a net plus cash flow of \$24,000 existed last year, but none of the above projects were completed. Our biggest expenditures include payroll: cook, kitchen crew, and house dad; HVAC repairs of \$20,000; and insurance premiums of \$27,000. Between Chapter dues, housing, and food, we had a total income of \$446,000 generated from September 2013 through August 2014.

Do recall that our goal is \$600,000. If we can reach that goal, all debt and all projects can be completed. What a position that would place us in! However, only 111 alumni have contributed to the campaign, which means over 1,000 Brothers have not. Please note that an additional pledge card is enclosed.
