

After the tutoring session, the students along with the brothers head to the gym to play a game or sport as a reward for the kids' homework achievements. With the assistance of

the program director, Susan Bryant, the brothers have managed to increase the program attendance by over 50% in the past two months. All the brothers agree that the students at Lonsdale probably teach them more than they have taught the students. Pi Kappa Alpha looks forward to continuing this program because of how fun, easy, and rewarding it is to give back to such a worthy cause.

Alumni Spotlight: Arthur B. Culvahouse, Jr.

Arthur B. Culvahouse, Jr. '67 is the Chair of O'Melveny & Myers LLP, an international law firm of approximately 900 lawyers with offices in Beijing, Brussels, Century City, Hong Kong, London, Los Angeles, Newport Beach, New York, San Francisco, Shanghai, Silicon Valley, Singapore, Tokyo, and Washington, DC. Culvahouse has practiced law with O'Melveny from 1976 to 1984, and from 1989 to the present. In addition to his executive duties as Chair of the Firm, Culvahouse has an active corporate governance, internal investigations and compliance, and strategic counseling practice.

From March 1987 through January 1989, Culvahouse served as Counsel to the President of the United States. As White House Counsel, Culvahouse advised President Ronald Reagan on matters ranging from the Iran-Contra investigations, to the Supreme Court nominations of Robert Bork and Anthony Kennedy, to the legal

aspects of the Intermediate-range Nuclear Forces Treaty; and he chaired the interagency lawyers Committee on War Powers and the President's Committee on Federal Judicial Nominations. In January 1989, President Reagan awarded Culvahouse the Presidential Citizens' Medal, an award established in 1969 to "recognize citizens who performed exemplary deeds of service for the country or their fellow citizens."

From June 1973 until November 1976, Culvahouse was Chief Legislative Assistant and Counsel to US Senator Howard H. Baker, Jr.

In May 2008, Culvahouse was chosen to head presumptive Republican presidential nominee John McCain's search for a Vice Presidential running mate. McCain's pick of Sarah Palin for vice president led to controversy over the vetting process. In 2009, Culvahouse defended his vetting in a speech to the Republican National Lawyers Assocation: Palin "had a lot of capacity. The
